

Assembly presentations to grades 1-3 utilize animated characters, gelatin brains and other age-appropriate ways to introduce the importance of protecting the brain and spinal cord. Use of helmets, booster seats and pedestrian safety stressed.



Students in grades 6-8 hear from VIP speakers — Voices for Injury Prevention — about how an injury to the brain or spinal cord changed their life. Injury prevention professionals and VIPs give presentations in science classes or assemblies.



High school and college students who are new, inexperienced drivers benefit from additional information on traffic safety. VIPs help them realize this could happen to anyone; the key is to buckle up and drive safely to protect themselves and others.



Concussion awareness, recognition and management is important for everyone to know. This program can be presented to grade 6 through adult, in any setting: health or science classes, athletic groups or as a hospital community education program.



Falls are a leading cause of injury for older adults and others at risk for falls. This basic introductory class can be given in a 1-hour or 2 1/2-hour class at hospitals, independent living centers or at other community settings, complete with useful handouts for attendees.



ThinkFirst For Your Baby is a four-hour class for new and expectant parents, covering a wide range of topics on protecting infants and establishing family safety practices. Topics cover car seat use, safe sleep, SIDS, Shaken Baby Syndrome, household hazards and more.
